## World Book Day

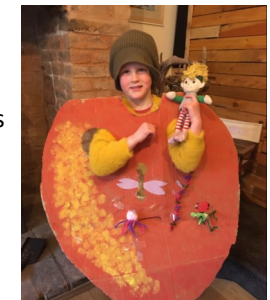
Well done to everyone who took part in this year's World Book Day. We had so many children complete the tasks set and enjoy being part of the special day both in school and remotely.
