



Are you our next Parent Governor?

Would you like to be more involved in the life of the school?

We have a vacancy for a Parent Governor and would welcome nominations from anyone interested in joining the Local Governing Committee. You are also welcome to nominate another person but please get their permission first. The position is open to anyone with parental responsibility for a child at the school. If we receive more than one nomination, we will hold an election by secret ballot of all parents.

The Local Governing Committee is responsible for setting the school's vision and values, and for determining school policies to reflect these. It also reviews and evaluates the implementation of the curriculum and ensures that the school is legally compliant in safeguarding and health and safety. However, the overall responsibility for running Spaxton School and the other schools in the Quantock Education Trust lies with the Trust Board and it is Trust Board that is legally accountable for the school.

No special qualifications are needed. The most important things are to have a keen interest in the school and to be prepared to play an active part in the local governing committee's work. All governors are required to complete induction and other training identified by the Trust and the Local Governing Committee.

If you would like to stand for election please request a nomination form available from the school office and return it to the school no later than Wednesday 30th March 2022. You should also include a short personal statement to support your nomination, which should be no longer than 250 words.

Free School Meals Is your child entitled to free school meals?

Parents and carers who receive any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support (IS)
- Employment Support Allowance (Income Related)
- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7400 after tax
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit, with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMR&C) of less than £16,190
