Safeguarding Update

After a safeguarding briefing from the local authority I have a variety of pieces to pass on.

From a Somerset study 38% of Primary children are using internet chat rooms or social networking in 2018. This is up from 25% in 2016.

Twitch (much like Youtube but based around gamers watching other gamers play) is a growing forum. This involves a chat feature and often displays inappropriate comments. There is a feature where the view can donate money to the online gamer. Twitch streams games with an 18 PEGI rating and the top five channels (with 11 million viewers) are Grand Theft Auto and Call of Duty. Twitch is known by the county safeguarding leads as gangs are using this to extort money out of children.

Finally musically is now called Tik. Tok and is reported regularly for cyberbullying through its chat feature. The age recommendation for this APP is 13 years old. If your child does have it please check the security settings and permissions are set to their highest.
