Curriculum Focus

In this section we will look at a different aspect of the 2014 National Curriculum.

Writing - Transcription

These are a progression of objectives in the area of 'transcription,' which means the act of writing. It may interest you to see how it runs from Year 1 up to Year 6. These are by no means the only transcription objectives for each year group but they are 'key' objectives.

Year 1 - Naming the letters of the alphabet in order

Year 2 – Can spell words correctly by saying them out loud (turning what they hear into correct letters and sounds)

Year 3 – Spell some homophones (words that sound the same but spelt differently – too, to, two.

Year 4 - Write from memory simple sentences, dictated by the teacher, that include words and punctuation taught so far.



Year 5 -Beginning to spell some words with 'silent'

letters [for example, knight, psalm, solemn].

Year 6 - Use dictionaries to check the spelling and meaning of words.

By working in tandem with our Educational Welfare officer (EWO) and to ensure that our policy is in line with other local schools, as of Thursday 1st September, the Governing Board have agreed to make alterations to the start of the school day.

As of 1st September the following structure will be in place:

8.45 am – Registration is open.

9.00 am-Registration is closed.

From 9.00 am - 9.15 am - If a child arrives between these times they are <u>late</u> and an 'L' code is marked on the register.

From 9.15 am onwards – If a child arrives after 9.15 am they are marked as having an unauthorised absence (U code) for the whole morning session.

The structure outlined above and its relevant codes are already in existence but it is the timings that have been altered.

As you may be aware, we take good attendance very seriously and look at the children's absences on a fortnightly basis. Good attendance is the cornerstone of accelerated progress and so we take any chance we can to highlight the need for excellent attendance to ensure that all children have the attendance they need in order to learn and reach their potential.
