Curriculum Focus

In this section we will look at a different aspect of the National Curriculum.

Handwriting

EYFS – Uses some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning

Y1 - Begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.

Y2 - Write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters.

Y3 - Beginning to use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left un-joined.

Y4 - Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting

Y5 - Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed

Y6 - Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed by choosing the writing implement that is best suited for a task.
