


Class news

In this newsletter the classes are sharing news about their work, including their current class text.







Starling Class – This half term we have really enjoyed exploring poems linked to our topic of seasonal changes. We have explored using descriptive words linked to our senses, expanding our vocabulary to explain what we see, hear, smell and feel. This has been linked to our key text of 'Tree, Seasons Come and Seasons Go' which has supported our younger readers to segment words in preparation for writing and the Key Stage 1 children to identify, read and write words with the suffix 'ing'.

Kingfisher Class- In English we began the year reading In our Hands by Lucy Farfort, exploring a world without colour and what life would be like without it. We learnt the importance of illustrations within a text and how to recreate them.

We then moved on to exploring the Iron Man an amazing story linked to our science topic of forces and magnets. We have explored the use of expanded noun phrases to add details to our writing and created some amazing pieces of poetry inspired by the text.

We have also been predicting what we think will happen next and putting ourselves in the characters shoes by acting out different parts of the story.

We have also enjoyed our class reader The Sheep-Pig by Dick King-Smith, we loved hearing about the adventures on Mr Hogget's farm.







Peregrine Class - This term we are reading Cosmic by Frank Cottrell-Boyce. This book is about a boy called Liam who looks much older than his age! This allows him to get into lots of mischief, including test-driving a Porsche! The children have used this book in order to develop their fluency reading skills, comprehension of their reading, as well as increasing their vocabulary choices. We have used it to develop description in writing a character profile, as well as using fronted adverbials in letter





writing. In our reading for pleasure time, we are reading 'The Longest Night of Charlie Noon' by Christopher Edge. He is becoming one of our favourite authors with the class reading a range of his other books as well.
