Reading

Reading is a hugely important life skill to have and opens up a world of wonder and excitement. Sharing a book with your child can be a hugely rewarding, this can be your child reading to you but also children love being read too.

As a way of encouraging all children to read at home, we have a new reward system in place. All children who read at home at least 3 times a week will be rewarded with a raffle ticket at the end of the week. Those raffle tickets are then collected over the course of the half term and one winner from each class will be drawn out and they will be rewarded with a book.
